- There are concrete economic advantages in the energy integration of all Latin American countries
 - Maximize infrastructure utilization
 - Seasonal complementarities
 - Swap best market opportunities
- Despite the current difficulties with Mercosul, there are strong political motivations for this integration
- The Andean Pact and Central American Regional Market experiences are positive and serve as models for the other countries

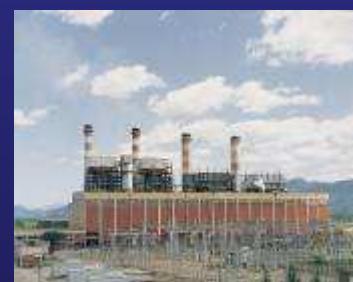
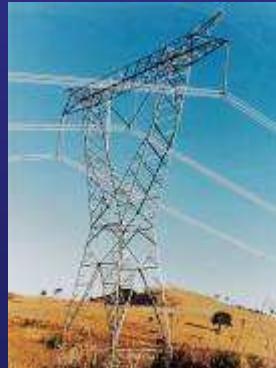

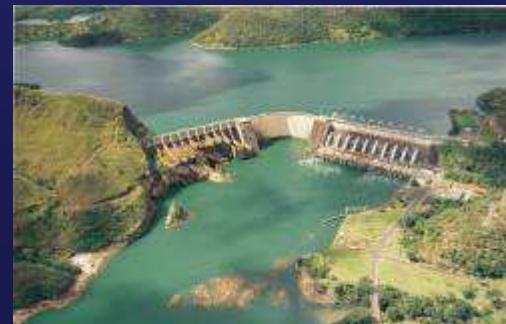

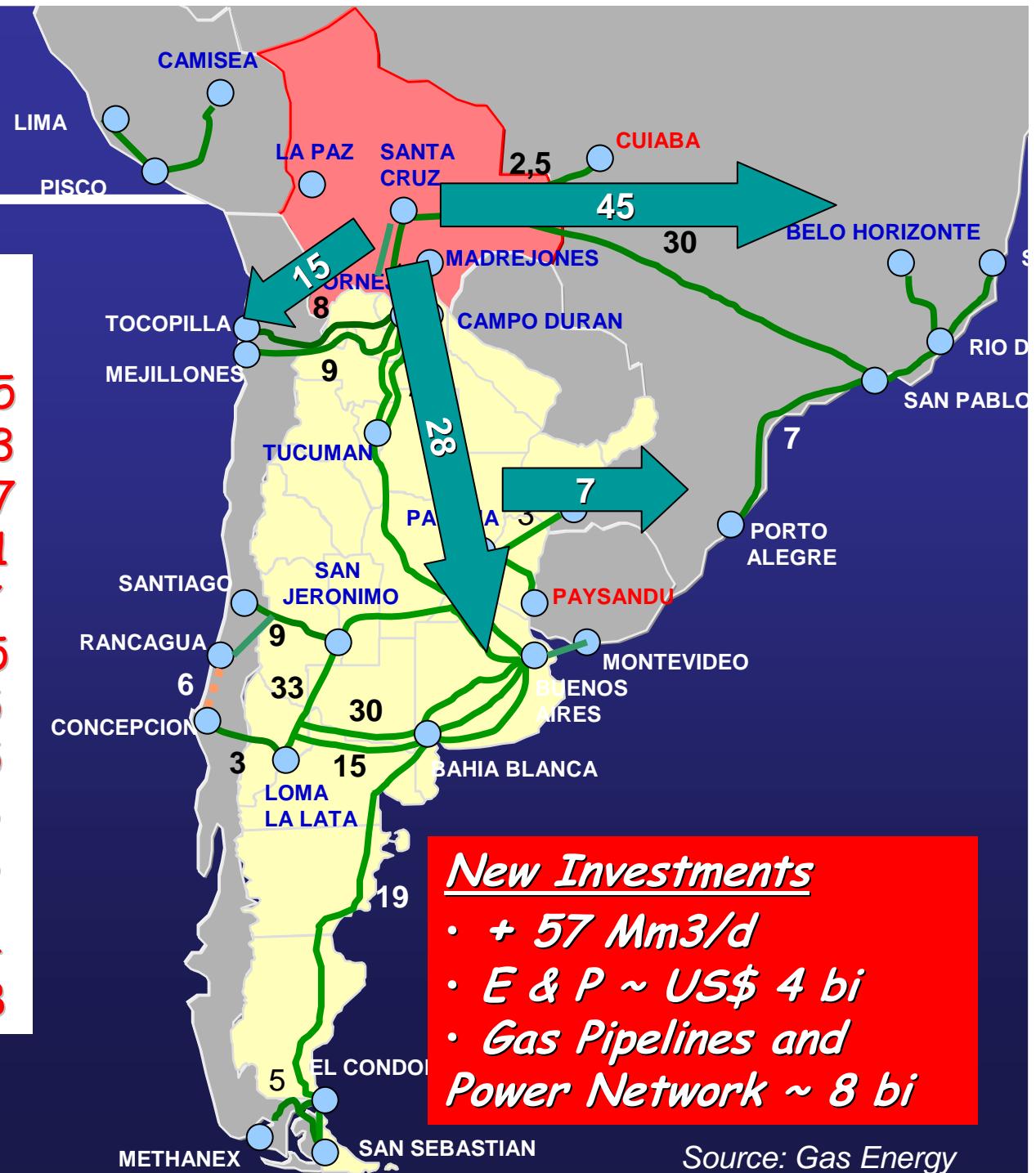

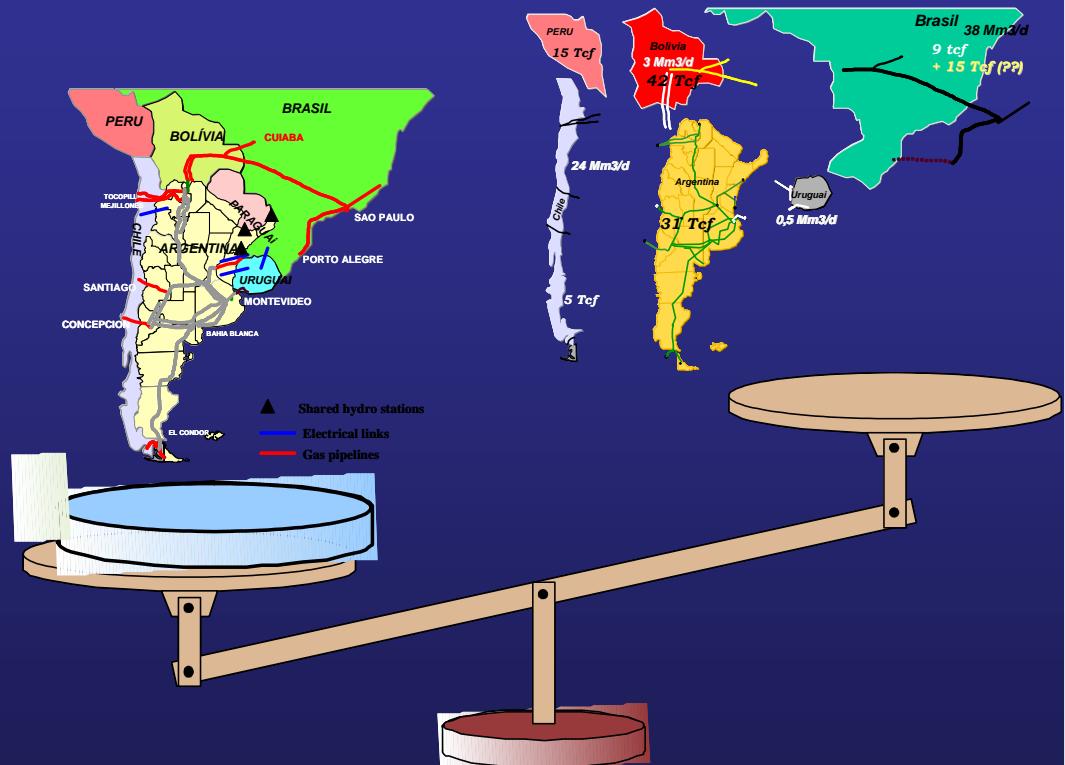


Southern Cone Integration
