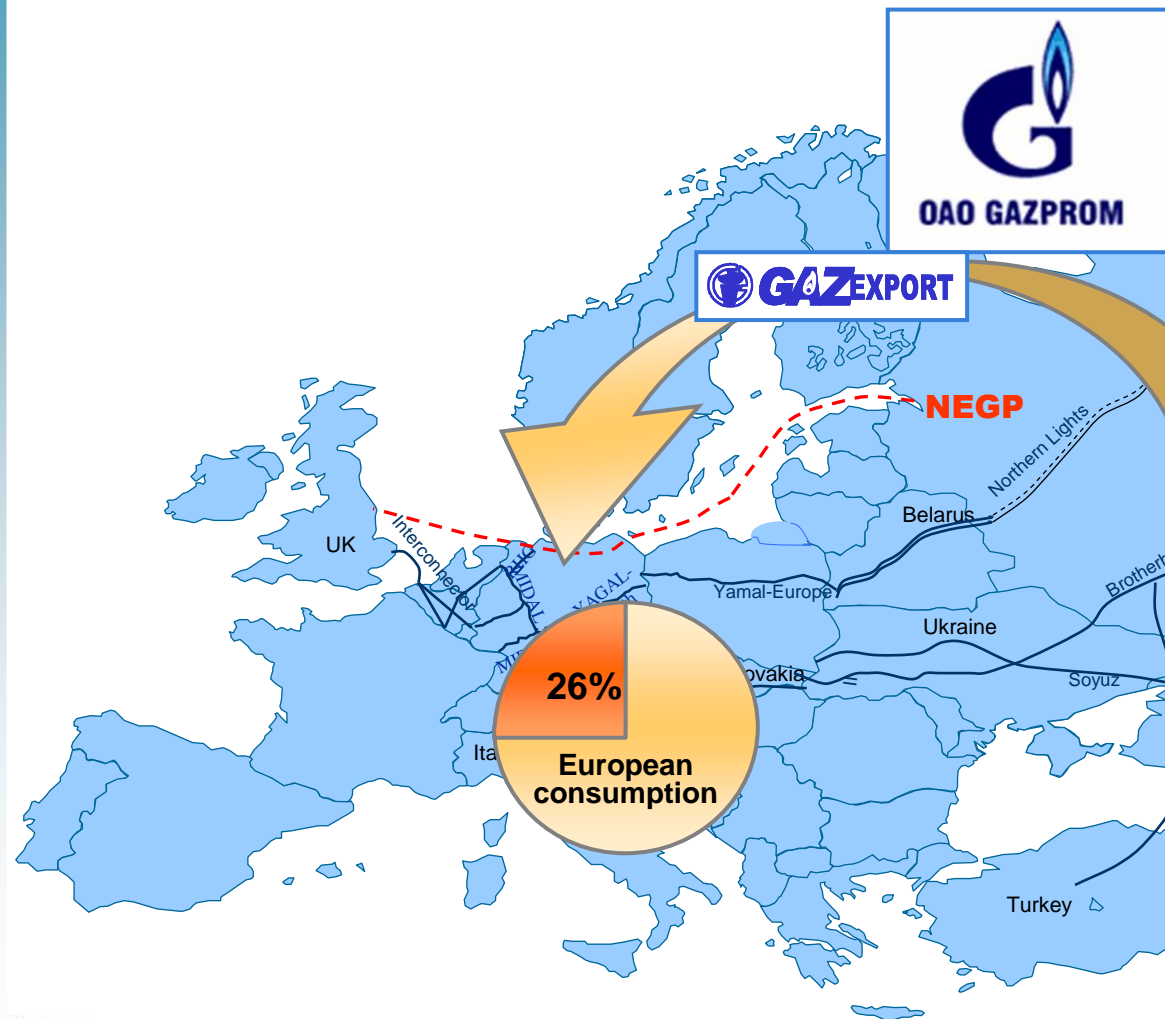


# Gazprom – Largest Gas Supplier in Europe

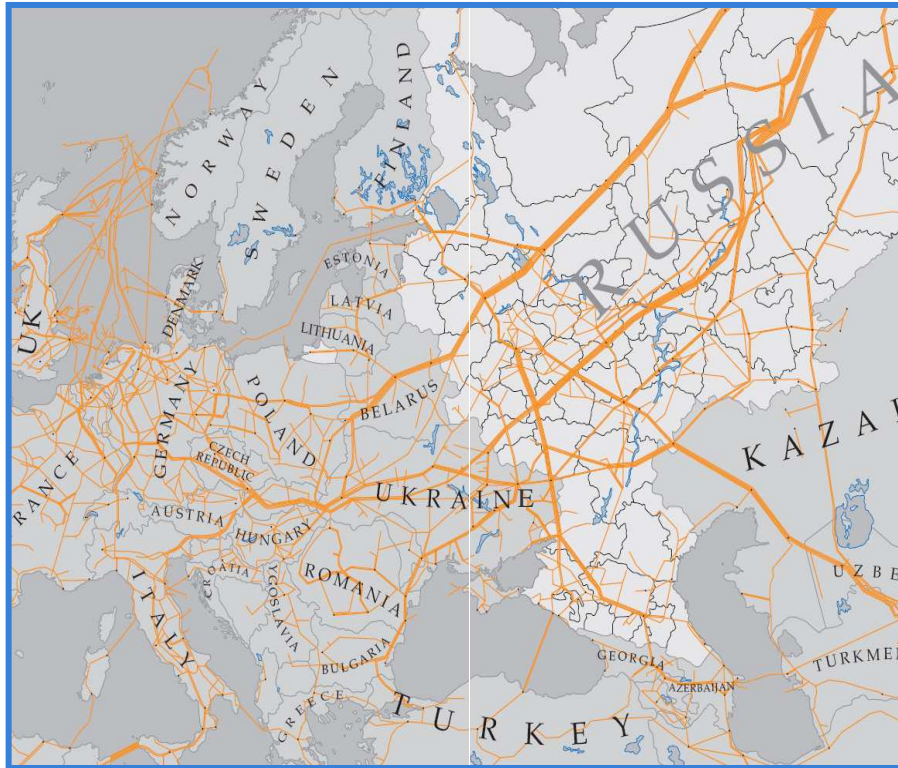


## GAZPROM:

- Total exports in 2005 –  $147.0 \cdot 10^9$  cm
- Exports to EU in 2005 –  $118.4 \cdot 10^9$  cm
- Gas imports in Europe – 35%
- Total exports in 2006 (forecast) -  $151 \cdot 10^9$  cm

# To exploit growing export opportunities in the European market Gazprom is planning to build a new gas pipeline with a capacity of $55 \cdot 10^9$ cm/year
