
LNG for transport: Customer Benefits & Enablers

- A performing and environmental friendly technology
- Development assistance required in addition of regulations efforts
 - → ECA's; Euro VI standard for Trucks; Taxes incentives
- European programs
 - → Blue Corridor; LNG Master Plan for Rhine Main Danube
- Financial incentives
 - → Ex: Implementation of discounts by several ports (according environmental footprint of the ships)
- Enablers



- → Players ready to invest in the infrastructures
- → Customers need to be supported

A new market for ENGIE: LNG as fuel for shipping

Bunkering

- → A potential up to 20-30 Mtpa worldwide
- → Norway, Scandinavia ahead in Europe

ENGIE has made a significant step in Europe :

- → LNG Bunkering Vessel (LBV) developed by ENGIE, Mitsubishi & NYK
- → Compatible with most of European ECA's terminals
- → Ship to ship transfer
- → Operational end of 2016
- → UECC first customer getting ahead on fuel topic

Inland shipping

- → 80% of inland shipping traffic in the Danube-Rhine-North Sea ports corridor
- → Trucks to ship experience in The Netherlands by LNG Solutions







A new market for ENGIE: LNG for road transportation


- A potential up to 30-40 Mtpa worldwide with a significant share for China
- About ~1300 LNG fuelling stations in China, ~70 in US and ~50 in Europe in operation
- Converted trucks is the major part of LNG vehicles currently present in China, US, UK & Spain roads
- The Group ENGIE is developing LNG Fuel supply in Europe
 - → LNG Solutions in the Netherlands (2 stations + 4 additional end 2015)
 - → GNVert in France (2 Blue Corridor LNG Stations + 2 stations in 2015)
