IGU Annual Report 2005

(For information purposes)

What is IGU?

The International Gas Union, which was established 75 years ago, is a world-wide non-commercial, non-political and non-government organisation with currently 89 members from all over the world. These members are primarily the most representative gas organisations or companies of a country, which may encompass producers, transporters, distributors, technological and scientific institutes, and appliance manufacturers.

Until 2003, the IGU Membership typically consisted of National Gas Associations or National Gas Companies with only one member from each country. New members were initially approved as Observer members and could then later become Charter members.

Following the changes in the IGU Articles of Association (AoA) approved in September 2002, all current members automatically became Charter members as of 1 January, 2003 and from every member country other individual Associations or companies related to the Gas Industry could from then on join as Associate Members. Since then, a profound interest in becoming an Associate member has prevailed and with this new concept IGU has broadened its knowledge base and the network considerably.

Apart from the Charter member of the country in question, up to nine Associate Members can be permitted from each country (ref. below).

The main objective of IGU is to promote the technical and economic progress of the gas industry world-wide mainly by facilitating the exchange of information of both a technological nature and of a more general, business-oriented nature. To this end it organises the World Gas Conference and Exhibition and manages currently nine Working and Programme Committees that study all aspects of the gas industry from the wellhead to the burner tip. The Committees report at the World Gas Conference every three years.

The Vision of IGU is: "Recognising that natural gas has an important part to play in satisfying the global need for an environment-friendly energy source, IGU will be the most influential, effective and independent non-profit organisation, while serving as the spokesman for the gas industry world-wide."

Together, IGU's members cover nearly 95 % of marketed world gas production. As a result of the advance of natural gas in the world's energy balance and the ever increasing number of countries - now standing at about 100 - where gas is being used or emerging, IGU is expanding its network with more developing countries.



Major IGU Activities in 2005 - and beyond

- World Gas Conference (WGC)

The Japanese Presidency with Mr. Hiroshi Urano as President of IGU, came to a close at the end of the 22nd World Gas Conference held in Tokyo, Japan on 1-5 June 2003 being the first WGC ever held in Asia.

After this, the previous Vice President, Mr. George H.B. Verberg took over as IGU President. His term will be concluded at the 23rd WGC in Amsterdam, the Netherlands on 5-9 June 2006.

The theme for the Dutch Presidency and the 23rd WGC is: "Gas: Powers the People, Preserves the World, Promoted by IGU".

The Call for Papers regarding WGC 2006 was issued on 1 March 2005 with deadline for submission of abstracts on 1 September 2005. By November, the papers and posters were finally selected in order for the full papers to be submitted by 1 February 2006.

The General Programme and Registration form for WGC 2006 was issued and distributed around the world in November 2005. The Conference will continuously be promoted at international events and in public media. More information can be obtained from the official website: www.wgc2006.nl which is updated on a regular basis.

The WGC 2006 Exhibitor's technical manual was circulated during June 2005. Some 17,500m² Exhibition space (net) have so far been made available by the organisers of which some 12,000m² have been reserved.

Back in 2002, IGU elected with acclamation Argentina to take over the Presidency 2006-2009 and to be the Venue of the 24th WGC in autumn 2009. The 24th WGC will take place in Buenos Aires on 19-23 October 2009.

Following the Council's voting in October 2005, Malaysia will take over the IGU Presidency 2009-2012 and be the host of the 25th World Gas Conference 2012 in Kuala Lumpur.

- 7th Global Conference on Information and Communication (ICT)

Hosted by IGU's Korean Charter member, the 7th Global Conference on Information and Communication Technology in Energy (ICT 2005) was held with great success in Busan, Korea in May. Planned by the IGU Task Force on ICT, also World Energy Council (WEC) and World Petroleum Council (WPC) participated in the preparations.

- UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)

As earlier, IGU took part in meetings within the UNFCCC, having decided on a more active approach already back in the year 2000.



At the 11th Conference of the Parties (COP 11) held in Montreal on 28 November-9 December 2005, IGU was present in the adjacent table exhibition promoting its views on Sustainable Development/Climate Change. At COP 10 the year before, IGU organised a Special Event presenting the first Draft of its Vision Paper on the issue 'Future role of Natural Gas and Strategic Impact for IGU' bringing in speakers from the Netherlands and the President of the International Association of Natural Gas Vehicles (IANGV) to promote NGVs in a sustainable future. The Vision Paper will be finalized for presentation at WGC 2006.

- Technology Transfer

To initiate and stress IGU's commitment to accelerate transfer of technology among its members, IGU supported the initiative of Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) and Gas Authority of India Ltd. (GAIL) in the organisation of "Third Asian Gas Buyers' Summit" held on 14-15 February 2005 in New Delhi, India. The fourth Summit of this kind will be held 20-21 February 2006.

Furthermore, the IGU President and other IGU officers gave a number of presentations, including one at the 20th Scientific Meeting of Gas Experts in Croatia in May, another at the 1st Asia Pacific Natural Gas Vehicles Conference & Exhibition (ANGVA 2005) held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in July as well as one at the 18th World Petroleum Congress in late September 2005. The Secretariat

Since July 2000 the Secretariat of IGU has been located in Hoersholm, north of Copenhagen in Denmark. One full-time Assistant and a part-time secretary assist the Secretary-General. Office space is made available by DONG A/S, which also renders some supporting services.

Currently the Agreements stipulate that the IGU Secretariat will remain at this address until autumn 2007.

At its autumn 2005 session the Council elected with acclamation **Norway** to host the IGU Secretariat for at least six years beginning from autumn 2007 accepting nomination of a candidate for Deputy Secretary General from 1 July 2006.

Membership

In 2005 no new Charter member joined IGU but the following new Associated members were admitted:

- Bursagaz (Turkey)
- ConocoPhillips (USA)
- N.V. Nederlandse Gasunie (the Netherlands) and
- Petrochina Natural Gas and Pipeline Company (P.R. China).

Hence, the total membership at the end of 2005 amounted to 89, of which 22 were Associate members, A list of the countries represented as well as a list of Associate Members of IGU is enclosed.



The Membership fee for 2005 was EUR 4,500.- per year for both Charter and Associate Members, and it remains at that level for 2006.

Meetings of IGU Bodies

IGU's activities are supervised by the Council, the Executive Committee and the Coordination Committee (CC) which succeeded the Technical Co-ordinating Committee (TCC) 2000-2003. The Secretariat ensures that the business of IGU is conducted in accordance with the Articles of Association and along the directions of the President, the Council, the Executive Committee and the IGU Management Team.

The Council is the main ruling body of IGU in which each Member is represented.

The Executive Committee governs the IGU in accordance with the aims and means fixed by the Council.

Only Charter members can vote in the Council, but the group of Associate members currently have two representatives with voting rights in the Executive Committee.

The function of the Coordination Committee is to coordinate the activities of the IGU Working and Programme Committees and to provide for all arrangements relevant to the Programme for the next World Gas Conference.

Contacts with other International Organisations

IGU is generally aiming at increasing co-operation with other international organisations as part of a rationalisation scheme.

By the end of 2005 GERG (Groupe Européen de Recherches Gazières), Intergas Marketing, Marcogaz and the International Association for Natural Gas Vehicles (IANGV)/European Natural Gas Vehicles Association (ENGVA) were all organisations affiliated to IGU.

LNG 14 and LNG 15

IGU was a main sponsor involved in preparing the 14th Liquefied Natural Gas Conference (LNG 14), which took place in Doha, Qatar on 21-24 March 2004. IGU is in charge of the Secretariat of the Steering Committee, currently chaired by Mr. Michael J. Dugan of Gas Technology Institute (GTI) following the closure of LNG 14 and the launch of the LNG 15 Conference scheduled for 24-27 April 2007 in Barcelona, Spain. An LNG 15 Steering Committee meeting was held in Chigago, USA in June 2005.

IGRC

IGU was together with GTI the main sponsors behind International Gas Research Conference (IGRC) and prepared the IGRC 2004 held in Vancouver, Canada, 1-4 November 2004. The Policy Committee was chaired by Mr. George H.B. Verberg, President of IGU. Upon evaluation of IGRC 2004 the future



of the IGRC was decided upon in 2005 attaching it closer to IGU, and renaming it into IGU Gas Research Conference (same acronym). Gasunie Technology and Research (Netherlands) has taken over the role from GTI in hosting the IGRC Secretariat.

Intergas Marketing (IGM)

IGU has developed its close relationship with IGM during 2004-2005 having taken over the IGM Secretariat integrating this in the IGU Secretariat. Co-operation between IGU and IGM was formally strengthened by a mutual Memorandum of Understanding signed during the WGC in Tokyo in 2003. Some IGM subjects and IGM representatives are integrated in the work of IGU as indicated in the IGU Triennial Work Programme 2003-2006. The two entities have agreed that IGM is to be converted into a special IGU Committee (IGU Marketing Committee - IGM) and incorporated in its Triennial Work Programme 2006-2009.

Eurelectric

IGU has been represented in the Eurelectric Programme Committee preparing its Annual Convention.

Eurogas

IGU is represented by its President/Secretary General in the Plenary Meetings of Eurogas - and vice versa with Eurogas now being a Charter member of IGU.

Groupe International des Importateurs de Gaz Naturel Liquéfié (GIIGNL)

IGU is represented by its President in the General Assembly of GIIGNL.

World Energy Council (WEC)

IGU is normally represented in several working groups and bodies of WEC. The Secretary-General of IGU represents the Union in the meetings of the Executive Assembly. WEC participated in the IGU Task Force on Information and Communication Technology (ICT) preparing an ICT World Energy Congress to be held in Busan (Pusan), Korea on 23-25 May 2005.

World Petroleum Congress (WPC)

Demonstrating the wish among the Presidencies of IGU and WPC for closer cooperation, a Joint Statement of IGU and WPC was prepared and approved by the IGU Council in October 2003 and by the WPC Council in December 2003. WPC also participates in the above mentioned Programme Committee of the IGU Task Force on ICT, and both Organisations will engage themselves even more actively in each other's Events.

United Nations, Economic Commission for Europe (ECE)

IGU is represented by its Secretary-General in the Plenary Meetings of the Working Party on Gas in Geneva.

Communication

Fruitful communication both within the world-wide IGU organisation and with the outside world, is getting constant attention. Within IGU, its officers try to maintain close personal relationship with members by attending annual meetings and special events – when possible.

Thus during 2005 the President, the Secretary General and the CC Chairman attended numerous events both within IGU, with other International Organisations and at different Conferences.

The IGU website, found at www.igu.org, was launched in its current design back in 2002. While under continuous development, this website intends to offer "News, Views and Knowledge about Gas" to a broad audience both within and outside IGU. An entirely new website is planned to be launched in July 2006 including the IGU Collaboration Portal.

The current one is divided into :

- a public part with general and detailed information about IGU, its member organisations, its publications and its documentation.
It also contains general information from CC, a link to NOC/WGC2006 (providing information about the next World Gas Conference), numerous links to related organisations/energy entities as well as a Calendar of events.
- A "Members Only" part which requires Username and Password, containing internal messages and documents within the organisation as well as complete Membership representatives' contact details.
- Furthermore the Dutch Presidency has developed a special Collaboration Portal under the IGU website, being the communication Channel between the IGU Committees.

Practically all IGU members now have electronic contact with the IGU Secretariat.

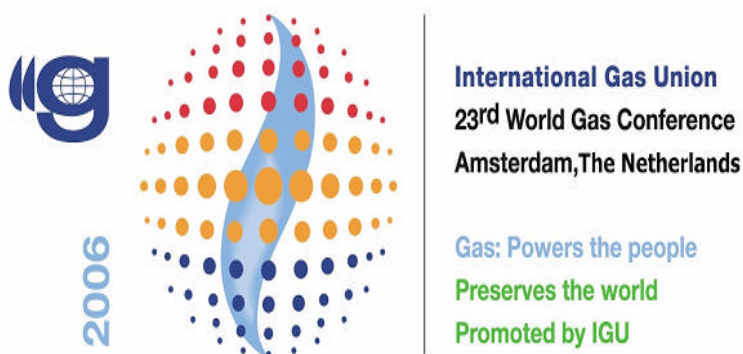
