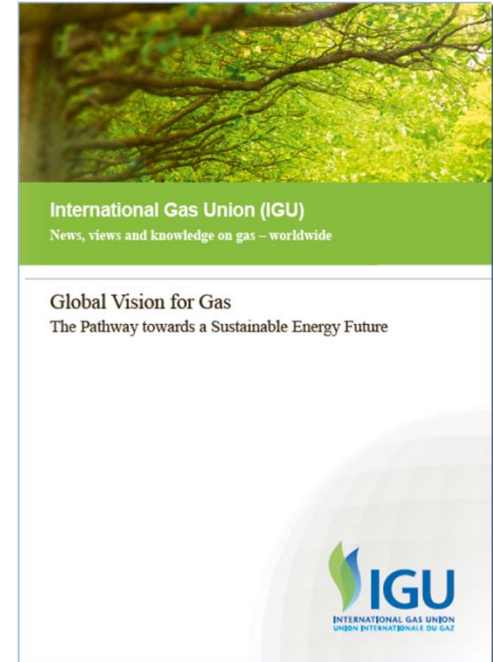
IGU Gas Award

Natural gas is a fuel well-suited to meet the global energy challenges:



- Reductions in energy use
- Enhanced energy efficiency
- Expanded use of low carbon technologies
- Greater resort to clean-burning natural gas replacing more carbon-intensive fossil fuels
- Natural gas can produce clean base load support for variable renewables (e.g. wind, solar)
