
Membership

- Charter member (max 1 per country):
 - normally Association but also Company or Gas department of Energy companies and the like
 - Voting rights in all IGU bodies
- Associate member (max 9 per country):
 - Any other gas entity if it contributes to IGU and owns assets related to the gas chain
 - May apply for charter membership after three years, may if applicable challenge existing charter member
 - Approval by the Council
 - 3 Associate members have voting rights in EXC

MISSION OF IGU (2)




- IGU serving as a global information clearing house will promote transfer of technology and know-how







PURPOSE:

To enhance the image and the impact of IGU in the world gas society and in the public in general

SCOPE:

- Reports from Committees and SG's
- Studies from Third Parties to which IGU gets access
- Proceedings from World Gas Conference



IGU COMMUNICATION Publication policy



When a report is finished:

A one page executive summary with conclusions and recommendations will be issued and submitted to the Council.

The Secretary General will apply either standard or special publication procedure



IGU COMMUNICATION Publication Policy



Proceedings from World Gas Conferences

Initially produced and distributed/sold by the host country

After the following Council meeting in the Autumn the proceedings are distributed free of charge by the Secretariat and displayed on the web



IGU COMMUNICATION Publication Policy



All published IGU reports to have a standard front cover

All published IGU reports to have a standard copyright clause giving joint copyright to the authors and IGU

In special cases reports may be sold to cover at least the cost of production






