# Abstracts : Statistics Overview

- **By the end of August the number of abstracts received was 888, it means 48% increase compared to WGC 2012**
- **Finally at the end of the extension period, the number abstracts received was 1467, nearly +100% compared to WGC 2012 and WGC 2009**
- **64 countries and TOP 20 : Iran , USA, France, Russia, China, UK, Algeria, Brazil, Turkey, Germany, The Netherlands, Japan, Korea, Qatar, India, Australia, Norway, Argentina, Venezuela, Canada and UAE.**
- **WOC 1 : around 280, with 155 for WOC 1.1, the TOP 1 SG !**

# Abstract: Review process

## Reviewing of abstracts by committees: 22 September – 9 November 2014

- The Chair of each committee will be sent the a link (or USB if requested) of all of the abstracts which have been submitted to their committee.
- The Chair will also receive a list broken down by the topic.
- The list will include the following information: the name of all the authors, the authors company details, the authors position, their respective countries, the paper title, and presentation type.
- The Chair will pass on all the relevant abstracts to the relevant committee members/study group leaders.
- The members can then read through all of the abstracts at their leisure.
- All of the reviewers (the study group leaders and the committee Chair/Vice Chair/Secretary) decide as to which abstracts are accepted, put on the waiting list or are declined.
- The Chair of the committee will have to access to a reviewers area where they will be able to view the abstracts again and enter the score of each abstract as their committee decided.
- WGC will check to ensure that all papers are reviewed and have a response allocated to them (accepted, declined, or on the waiting list) by the deadline and I will be available to offer any support.
- Once the scores have been completed by the deadline, an email will be sent to the main author who's contact details to notify whether their abstract was successful or not.

Authors assigned “waiting list” status will be advised if their paper is accepted or rejected

## Deadline for submission of final papers: 13 March 2015

Full papers to be submitted by this date

- ✦ **Selection Full Contributions:** opens on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2014, selection from September to November, author notification will be on 28<sup>th</sup> November.
- ✦ **Special Panels :** the chairs have to finalize the list of speakers before Berlin and after they will have to define the animation and interactivity with the attendance (workshop in Berlin)
- ✦ **Preliminary Program:** Completion and validation of sessions and room allocation, started in Beijing, validation in Sydney (see next slides)
- ✦ **Final Program :** All these elements will be integrated in the final program to be published in March 2015
