

2nd Floor Evacuation Routes





Houston General Information

Houston's Founders

The city of Houston was founded in August of 1836 by brothers Augustus and John Allen. The city is named after General Sam Houston, who led the Texas Army to its victory over General Santa Anna's Mexican forces at the 1836 Battle of San Jacinto. In 1837, the city of Houston was incorporated into the Republic of Texas and served as its capital from 1837 to 1840.


Population

Today the city of Houston has a population of over 4.3 million inside it's city and Harris County metropolitan borders. Houston is one of the few cities with permanent ballet, opera, symphony and theater companies. There are more than 30 museums, 500 parks, 100+ golf courses, 60 movie theaters and over 8,000 restaurants.

Houston is located in the Central Time Zone and has a mild year-round climate. The sales tax is 8.25 percent, no state income tax and property taxes are \$3.20+ per one hundred dollars of appraised value.

Economy

Rated as a beta world city, Houston's economy has a broad industrial base in the energy, manufacturing, aeronautics, transportation, and health care sectors and is a leading center for building oilfield equipment. Only New York City is home to more Fortune 500 headquarters within the city limits. The Port of Houston ranks first in the United States in international waterborne tonnage handled and second in total cargo tonnage handled. The city has a population from various ethnic and religious backgrounds and a large and growing international community. It is home to many cultural institutions and

exhibits-attracting more than 7 million visitors a year to the Houston Museum District. Houston has an active visual and performing arts scene in the Theater District and is one of few U.S. cities that offer year-round resident companies in all major performing arts. The legal drinking age in Texas is 21 and all drivers and passengers in Texas are required by law to use safety belts when riding in a car or truck.

Weather

Houston enjoys a subtropical and humid climate, with plenty of sunshine and an average annual precipitation of 50 inches.

Summer temperatures in Houston are at their hottest during July and August, when they can reach around 34°C/93°F. Turbulent weather can occur during this time in Houston, which can lead to tornadoes, especially during late summer.

Winters in Houston are cool, with January being the coldest month, when daytime temperatures reach highs of around 16°C/61°F. This is Houston's wettest season with the most rainy weather, although snow at this time of the year is rare.
